

Bordeaux's Chateaux, Rivers & Wine



TRIP OVERVIEW

Characterised by sprawling vineyards surrounding opulent châteaux, charming cities spliced by winding cobbled lanes, scenic beauty that flanks the Dordogne and of course, world-renowned wines — our seven day cruise affords you the opportunity to undertake fantastic optional trips, that include an exhilarating helicopter ride over Médoc and a tempting wine tasting experience.

ITINERARY & DETAILS

This document aims to give you all the information that you require for a smooth and comfortable trip on this river cruise. Please take the time to read this dossier to familiarise yourself with all the aspects of our river cruise. It includes important information such as flight details, visa requirements and travel insurance.

B = Breakfast, **L** = Lunch, **D** = Dinner.

Day 1: UK to Bordeaux D

Depart London on your scheduled flight to Bordeaux. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to your ship, MS Cyrano de Bergerac. Board your ship and enjoy a welcome cocktail with the crew before dinner. The cruise will set sail to Pauillac. You will board your ship at 6pm.

Day 2: Pauillac to Royan B/L/D

Today you will dock at Pauillac, and begin a tour of the prestigious wine-growing region of Medoc. Favoured by a mild, humid microclimate, this region produces some of the world's most sought-after red wines. The trail will take you along the famous Chateaux Route, past rolling valleys, verdant fields and the wine estates and elegant castles of Saint Julien, Margaux, Lafite-Rothschild and Latour. With stops along the route, sample the region's exquisite wines and discover why they are revered by connoisseurs across the globe. Cruise the Gironde until you reach the estuary. Dock in Royan and enjoy a panoramic tour of the seaside city.

Day 3: Royan B/L/D

Enjoy the day at leisure in Royan or alternatively join an optional excursion to the seaside cities of Rochefort and La Rochelle. Visit the Corderie Royale, a historical rope-making factory. Built between 1666 and 1669, it was the first industrial building in France, and the factory provided ropes for the French Navy and its ships for over three centuries. Tour the main building and learn about the techniques used to produce the ropes used on the large sailing ships. Afterwards, head to La Rochelle. Stop for lunch in a local restaurant. The over 1,000-year-old city of La Rochelle is the capital of the Charente Maritime. It's tucked along the Bay of Biscay and contains some of the most beautiful natural and architectural heritage in the area. During a guided tour of the old town and port, learn about the Grosse-Horloge gate, Renaissance arcades, lovely half-timbered homes, finely sculpted facades of the private mansions, and the cathedral. Enjoy some free time before returning to the ship. At the end of our afternoon, begin cruising to Libourne. Enjoy dinner and an evening of entertainment.

Day 4: Libourne to Bordeaux B/L/D

This morning enjoy a guided tour of Saint-Émilion's underground monuments, discovers the rich history of this medieval city, including its enigmatic monolithic church. Continue to a vineyard where you will learn how the famous local wine is produced. Enjoy a tasting of local products at the end of the tour. Return to the ship in Libourne and spend the afternoon cruising to Bordeaux.

Day 5: Bordeaux to Cadillac B/L/D

Cruise along the Garonne, getting a good glimpse of Bordeaux from the water as the ship continues to Cadillac. This morning visit the magnificent and prestigious Château de Roquetaillade. This castle has been the backdrop for several French films including Brotherhood of the Wolf (Le Pacte des Loups) and Fanfan la Tulipe. Explore the towers of this this medieval château before heading to a wine cellar in the Sauternais to enjoy a tasting of the famous Sauternes wine. Afterwards return to Cadillac for a guided tour of the city. Located on the right bank of the Garonne River, the city was founded in 1280 and still retains its original structure. Explore the port, its ramparts, and the main square and stroll the streets to admire the old homes and 15th-century church. Spend the afternoon cruising to Bordeaux and enjoy the gala evening.

Day 6: Bordeaux B/L/D

After breakfast on board depart to the center of Arcachon Bay. We will start our tour with a boat trip on the Bassin d'Arcachon. You'll be able to see the Bird Island, the famous "Cabanes tchanquées" houses on stilts and the oyster beds. Then, we will visit of the Oyster Centre and Museum located in Larros Port in Gujan Mestras. A modern, interactive scenography will help you discover oyster farming and the history of the oyster. We will have lunch in a local restaurant. In the afternoon, we will go to the Great Dune of Pilat. Culminating at 107m, it is the highest sand dune in Europe. The view from the top is awe-inspiring. Return to Bordeaux at the end of the day.

Day 7: Bordeaux to UK or extension B

Disembark the ship at 9am where you will transfer to the airport for your return flight back to the UK or continue on to your chosen extension.

Meals

Breakfast, lunch and dinner daily are taken onboard the ship. Tables seat 4 and 6 people, so you'll be able to converse and socialise with new friends, whilst never feeling crowded together. Tea and coffee are available on board ship as well as unlimited soft drinks and alcoholic drinks, including a variety of wines and beer, both during meals and at the bar. (Premium brands are available at an extra cost). Any dietary requirements and dislikes should be made known to our reservations staff at the time of booking. On embarking the ship, you will be greeted by the captain, crew and staff and treated to welcome cocktails.

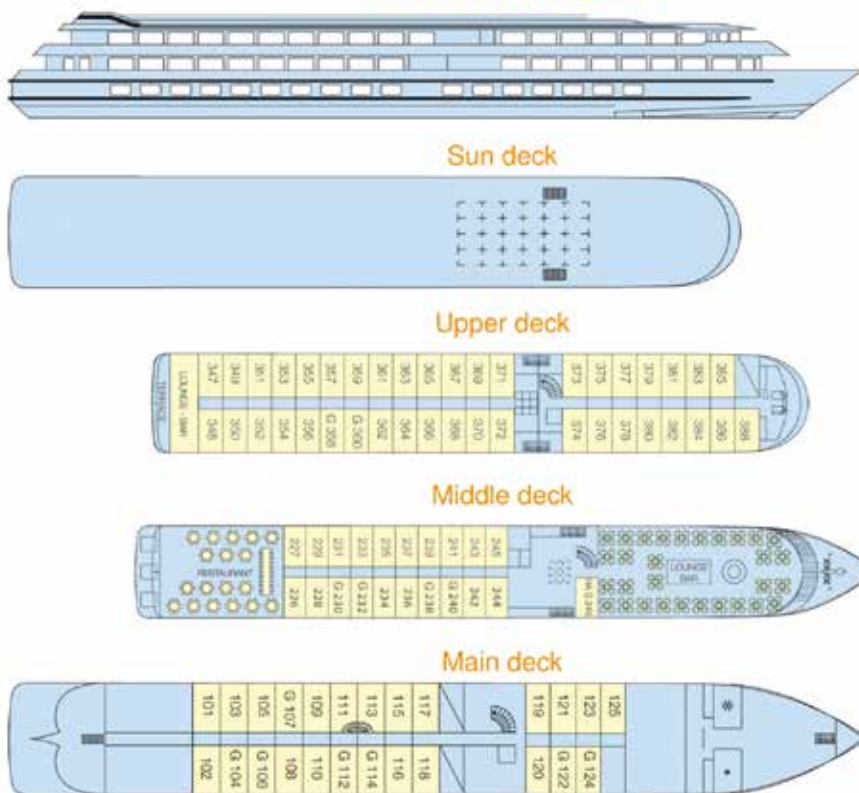

MS Cyrano de Bergerac

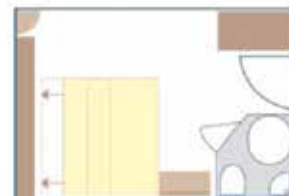


The Cabins

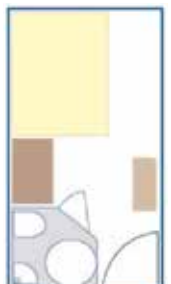
All cabins are equipped with shower and toilet, hairdryer, satellite TV, radio and safe.
Upper deck: 41 cabins (39 cabins with twin beds, 2 cabins with a double bed(G))
Middle deck: 21 cabins (16 cabins with twin beds, 4 cabins with a double bed (G) (can be separated into 2 singles), 1 disabled cabin with a double bed (HA G)
Main deck: 25 cabins with porthole (18 cabins with twin beds, 7 cabins with a double bed(G))

Twin Cabin

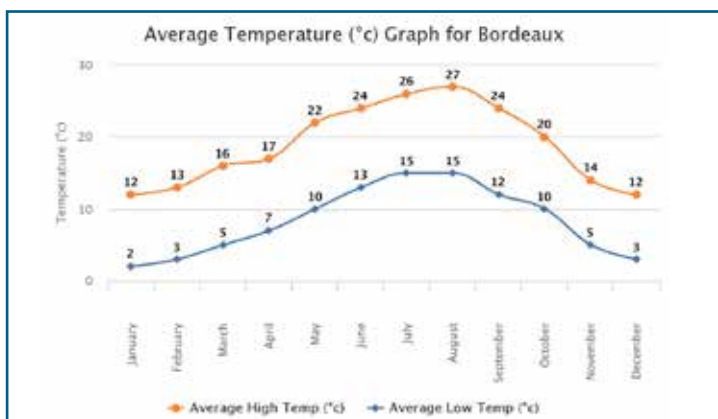


Double Cabin

WHAT YOU NEED FOR YOUR TOUR

Visas

A visa is not required for British nationals travelling to France. Further advice should be sought from the applicable tourist authority for other nationalities and for general queries. We strongly advise you check your destinations' Tourist Board or Embassy for the most up-to-date guidelines regarding passport validity.

Tour Guides

An English-speaking Cruise Director will be on board your cruise to help with any queries that you may have. While on excursions included in your itinerary, you will be accompanied by an English-speaking local tour guide. When exploring locally during your leisure time you will not be accompanied by a tour guide.

Tipping

Tipping is at your discretion. There is an envelope in your cabin for these purpose that can be handed to reception at the end of your cruise.

Currency Exchange

The currency in France as well as on board is the Euro (€). We recommend that you exchange your currency before you leave the UK. It is important that you budget carefully and ensure you have the right form of currency before you arrive in the country. Cash machines will also be available throughout the tour in order to withdraw money in your local currency.

Personal Expenses

This cruise is All-Inclusive, so you will only need to take a little extra money with you to cover any premium drinks on board and souvenirs, drinks and snacks purchased when off the ship, as well as any optional excursions you wish to book.

Credit Card Information

Credit cards are accepted on board ship and throughout France.

Electricity Supply

The electricity supply is 220V. You will need a European two pin round plug adapter in France.

Dress Code

There is no official dress code on board, however you'll be most comfortable during the day in smart casual clothing. You may wish to bring items that do not wrinkle easily as there is no iron provided on board ship. There are also no laundry facilities available. Bring a variety of clothing for the weather expected on your cruise, including light clothing and bathing suits for hot weather, a jumper or jacket for cooler weather and of course a raincoat and/or small umbrella.

Itinerary Changes

Some of the highlights may only be seen on optional excursions at an additional cost, or by exploring independently.

Health and Vaccinations

Physical Accessibility

This river cruise is accessible to most people with an average level of fitness and normal mobility. It involves moderate days of walking on cobble streets and getting on and off the cruise ship. This cruise is not suitable for anyone with walking difficulties.

Insurance

We strongly recommend that you and all members of your party are suitably insured as soon as you book your holiday. It is a condition of booking that you must have suitable travel insurance. It is important that you purchase travel insurance that suitably covers your participation in whatever activities you may undertake at the time that you make your booking. EMBARKING & DISEMBARKING

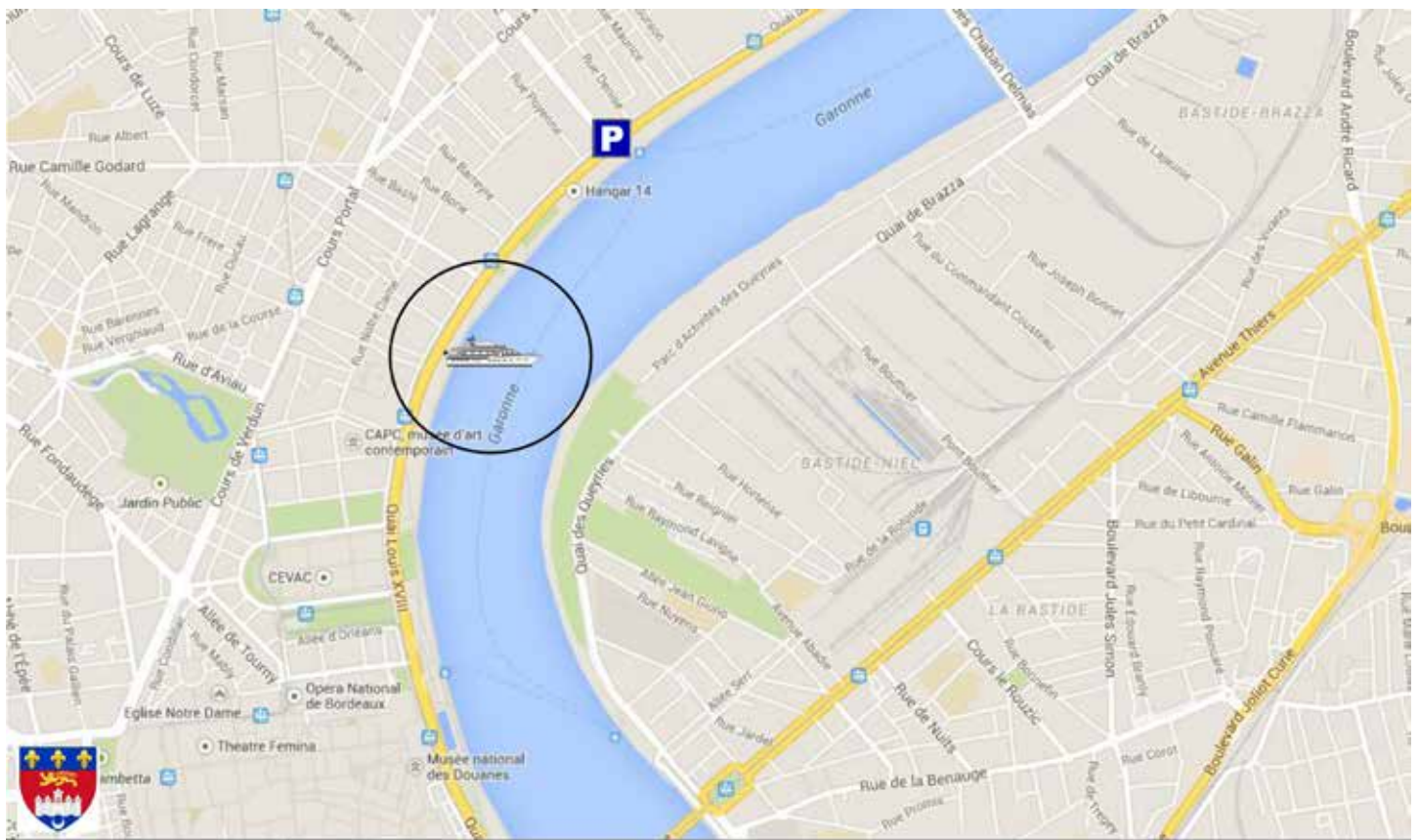
Embarkation Time: 6pm
